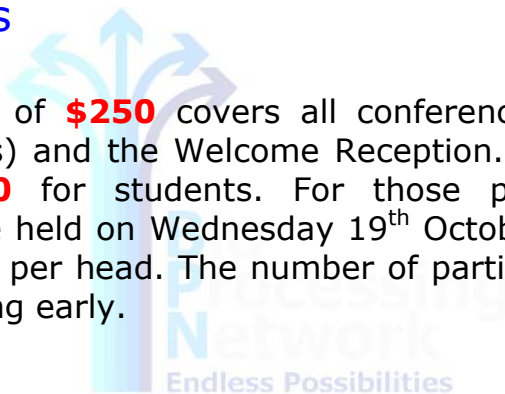
Important Dates
